FROM THE DESK OF DR. SHARMAN

Dear Friends,

Waiting...waiting for God to speak, waiting for life to change, waiting for a new job or a new life. Many of you have commented that you are indeed waiting, during these long days of summer.

Remember the teaching of the Psalmist in Psalm 130, that God is in the process, and joins us on the journey. Remember to open the Word (Ps 130:5) and read and then listen for God's voice. God wants to speak to us through His Word. Finally, remember to wait *on* the Lord even as you wait *for* the Lord—the work of the waiter/waitress is everyone's work!

In the meantime, we're still waiting on our tomatoes! While you wait, here's the recipe for *Fried Green Tomatoes*.

Slice the green tomatoes (skin on) reasonably thickly: 3/8 inch or 1/4 inch at least.

—Too thin, and all you taste is the "fried"—thicker is better.

Heat 2 or 3 tablespoons of olive oil on medium heat. The tomatoes will absorb the oil, so put an ample amount—yet not too much or it will be difficult to make them crunchy. Use a bit; then add more if needed.

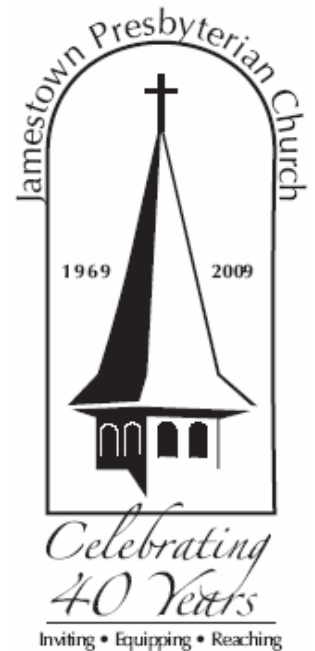
While the oil is heating mix equal parts flour and cornmeal. Add salt and pepper—we use ground sea-salt and fresh-ground pepper. Use a little more than you think you will need! This is a perky tasting dish!

Cover the tomato slices with the mixture—green tomato slices can be rather dry, so push hard. Then fry them!

Be patient—this is not an instant dish. 1st the tomatoes will cook to a tender texture, then you have to be patient to get them crunchy. I turn them several times, to make sure they aren't burning. Some will get crunchier than others, but they will all taste great, we promise.

We eat them without any sauce, yet most any sauce or salad dressing will taste great on *Fried Green Tomatoes*!

MINUTE-FOR-MISSION — UNION HILL TUTORING

Do you remember listening to your child read---seeing a word that was unfamiliar and you pronounced it for her? Then later, when she came upon that word again, the beam that came into her face as she proudly read that word?

Or, do you remember calling out spelling words and how proud your child was when he could spell all of the words correctly---and made "100" on the weekly spelling test?

Or, perhaps you recall helping him by explaining how one solves a problem in arithmetic.

One encounters all of these situations as a tutor at Union Hill Elementary School. A lot of the CIS students don't have anyone at home to listen and assist. As a Community In Schools--or CIS---tutor, this important gap is filled. And the tutor becomes more than just a tutor, but also a friend---which may be just as important as tutoring.

It is a rewarding task, and there are some humorous moments as well. When listening to the student read, if there is a word I think the child may not know, I stop and ask if he knows the meaning of that word. One little fellow read the word "boring;" I asked if he knew the meaning of "boring." He said he did, and I asked him to tell me. He looked at me and replied---"What we are doing right now." We then continued with the reading!

On Sunday, June 7, 2009, Ruth Clark presented the JPC Women Honorary Life Membership award to Bart Frankena. This award is given to individuals who have given exceptional service to the Women of the Church organization and to the church as a whole.

Bart and Ruth Frankena joined JPC in 1981 and both have been very involved in our activities through the years. Bart has served as Elder, chaired the Property Committee and worked with its other members over the years to accomplish many projects. Some of the most recent projects include the installation of the elevator, the supervision and renovation work of the narthex, the parlor kitchen and bathroom and the redesign and building of the closet storage in our classrooms. When the bookstore needed a permanent location, he designed and built a complete unit for that purpose. In addition, the installation of the Columbarium and courtyard fountains has added to the exterior beauty of the church.

But Bart is far more important to the church than even his skilled workmanship would imply. He is very active in Men of the Church and Men's Bible study. As part of JPC's mission and outreach activities, he is a Stephen Minister and Pilgrimage participant. He is part of the prison ministry known as Kairos, goes on mission trips to Sunset Gap, and has been an outstanding mentor to our youth on ASP mission trips. He has served at the winter emergency shelter at First Presbyterian in Greensboro and at the homeless shelter. In all of this, his personal faith and commitment to leading a Christian life shines through.

Bart was presented with a framed certificate of honor and a lapel pin (which he may be sharing with Ruth). The pin is made up of giving hands, dove of peace and the cross. The overall design is that of a butterfly, a symbol of newness in Christ.

Say hello to Chris Henry, the smooth base guitar player (and other instruments) in our contemporary worship band, *Decided*.

As he grew into middle school, he began playing the trumpet. While in the eighth grade, he developed a curiosity for the guitar and became a self taught guitarist by listening to the music of Eric Clapton and the Dave Mathews Band. As Chris continued to grow, so did his love for music, where after high school graduation he enrolled in Greensboro College. As Chris puts it, "there was never a question that music was what he was supposed to do, and that Greensboro College was where he was led to pursue it." While there, he forged a relationship with Dr. Jon Brotherton, who later brought Chris into our midst with his music when the contemporary service was in its infancy. We are so blessed to have Chris Henry as part of JPC's music ministry.

Chris is also an accomplished composer and has written many of the songs we so enjoy at the contemporary service.
