## From our New Interim Pastor, Dr. Arnold Lovell



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and Peace from God our Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ!

Through out the history of the Christian Church, these words of the Apostle Paul have been read and used as Christians have communicated with one another. With that in mind, and by the leading of the Holy Spirit, I use these words to share with you my first letter, or epistle, as did Paul, as Emily and I come to be with you in *partnership in the Gospel* at Jamestown Presbyterian Church!

I am excited and looking forward to being with you beginning August 1<sup>st</sup> to serve as your Interim pastor, as we work to continue to strengthen your congregation and its ministry in preparation for your Installed Pastor. In meeting the members of the Transition Team, and listening to their vision for your future, I was convinced this was the place God was calling me to do ministry, and share my gifts in obedience to His call on my life. As we look toward our time of beginning our work together, let me share a little more about the Lovell family with you!

Emily and I are both natives of Davidson County, me being from Lexington, and Emily from Denton. I am a graduate of Appalachian State University, and she attended East Carolina University. We both taught school at West Davidson High School, Tyro, NC, meeting there as colleagues, and marrying in 1976. In 1977, I left teaching, and attended Union Theological Seminary, graduating in 1981 with the Doctor of Ministry degree, beginning my service as a Minister of Word and Sacrament.

Over the last three decades, I have served in a number of positions for our denomination and the Church: as Senior Minister and Head of Staff of two larger membership churches, First PC, South Charleston, WV, and at Second PC, Knoxville, TN; as Professor of Evangelism, Union Theological Seminary, VA, and I was recently appointed to Princeton Theological Seminary as an Assistant Professor, Adjunct Faculty; as an Intentional Interim Pastor, First PC, Johnson City, TN; and, as a consultant, teacher, author, and counselor with churches, leaders, and pastors.

Emily and I have two daughters, both of whom live in Winston-Salem. Carolyn and Catherine each graduated from Presbyterian College in Clinton, SC. Carolyn, 32, earned her Masters degree in Reading from Appalachian State in 2008 and is an English teacher at Paisley International Baccalaureate Middle School. Catherine, 29, earned her Masters degree in Public Administration from the University of Tennessee in 2005 and currently serves as the Office Coordinator of Hospitality Services, Wake Forest University Baptist Medical Center.

During the last weeks, as we have begun packing boxes, looking forward to our move, and anticipating our time with you, Emily has also taken a position in Guilford County. Having taught in the field of Exceptional Children, Emily recently accepted a position at Ferndale Middle School, and will begin work there next month. We are both excited to be involved in your community and with you as a congregation.

In addition, Emily is an Ordained Presbyterian Elder, having served on the Session of the Ginter Park Presbyterian Church, while I was on the faculty at UTS. So, she has been active in the church not only as a member, but leader as well in her own right.

As we come to be with you this next Sunday, we will be in prayer for us all, that this time will be one of grace, peace, and growth for us all. As I prepare, I am thankful that I know I am coming to a church that I have already worked with, as you were a demonstration church for my Evangelism classes while I taught at UTS, and I also worked with you during the time of the pastorates of Larry Avent and Denny Sebesan.

*But, even more, I am encouraged knowing you have been so fortunate to have been cared for by the wise, gentle, and loving hands of Dr. Jim Wagner.* I know from his leadership in my home church, First PC, Lexington, and his reputation, that he is the consummate scholar, pastor, and peer, and I hope I can care for you half as well as he did.

I will begin preaching on August 8<sup>th</sup>, starting our reflections in worship with a Sermon Series entitled, *Life and Ministry Together*. The first sermon in this series is *Partnership in the Gospel*, based on Paul's letter to the church at Philippi, the first chapter. And, in closing, I look forward to sharing this partnership with you in the days and months ahead.

Jamestown Presbyterian Church is hosting its first Children's Consignment Sale. It is open to anyone from the church or community who wants to participate. Consignors get 70%, JPC Ministry Teams get 25%, and Victory Junction Gang Camp gets 5% of the proceeds.

Victory Junction Gang Camp was founded by Adam Petty prior to his death. "VJGC" serves children with 24 chronic medical conditions such as, but not limited to, Autism, Cancer, Craniofacial Anomalies, Diabetes, Epilepsy, Hemophilia, Neurological Disorders, Sickle Cell, and Spinal Bifida. Since its opening in 2004, it has served over 11,000 children and their families free of charge. These families have come from 47 different states and two countries. We are lucky enough to have the camp right here in Randleman, North Carolina, just about 45 minutes away from most in Guilford County. Jamestown Presbyterian is lucky enough to have two of their families who have experienced the benefits of this camp made especially for their Special Needs Children. It is a camp where typical children say, "I want to go there." Campers have access to a bowling alley, sports arena, golf course, maze, tree house, pool, gym, horseback riding and small animal barn, beauty salon, snack bar, and who could forget the racecar like experience designed just for Special Needs Children.

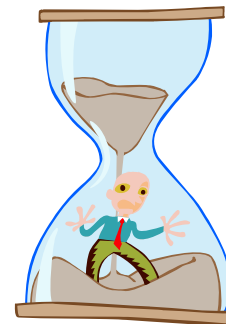

### SUNSET GAP - 2010

If you didn't attend our 8<sup>th</sup> annual mission trip to Sunset Gap, then you missed a wonderful experience. You probably didn't miss working in the mid-90s+ degree heat each day, or hauling boards, or pounding a hammer, or the bugs, or the sunburn or even sleeping in bunk beds. But if you missed those things, then you probably also missed the camaraderie and the relationships built from working together on a team and the joy that comes from helping to better the life of another human being in God's kingdom.

This year 38 men, women and youth formed the JPC team that worked on three projects at Sunset Gap: 1) Phase 1 of three in building a house for a woman with stage three cancer (who is now living in a trailer with mold and holes throughout), 2) Phase 2 of three in building a house to sell to a needy family, and 3) Providing Vacation Bible School for the children in the depressed area around Sunset Gap. Two different teams will complete the next two phases of each house by the end of July. The ages on our teams ranged from 14 to 70+, and believe it not, there was no generation gap; everyone worked as a team. It was delightful to work alongside others from JPC that you may not have gotten to know in our church setting.

Building the first phases meant our teams had to build the floors, exterior walls, interior walls and put on the roof of both homes they were working on. Their day would start with breakfast at 6:30 a.m., devotions, and off to the worksite. No gourmet lunches for these groups – PB&J was the cuisine of each day along with plenty of water and Gatorade. They wrapped up the day around 3:00 p.m.; cleaned up, drove back and then either went swimming, played Corn Hole, or just relaxed each afternoon. Dinner was at 6:30 p.m. followed by evening devotions and sharing of the day's events.

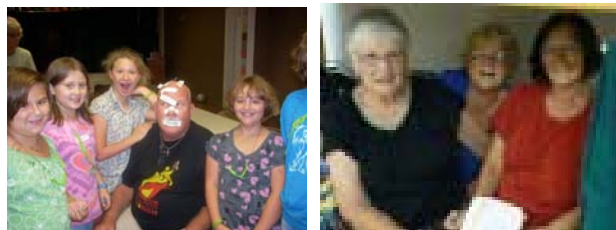
## OUTREACH MINISTRY

There were about 21 different kids that came to Vacation Bible School but we averaged about 18 per day. We were able to use the theme, lessons and DVDs of the curriculum from the previous VBS at JPC – Crocodile Dock. The lesson involved the story of Moses: the burning bush, the seven plagues and the escape from Egypt including the crossing of the Red Sea. The week was made particularly exciting with our guest actor: Pharaoh, played by 'Just Fred' Werstlein. The kids delighted in seeing Fred in full costume each day, making the lesson come alive. The highlight of the week was the wonderful meals prepared and served each day by our fabulous cooks: Marge Baughman, Ruth Frankena and Kathy Van Dorp. They were up early every morning to prepare breakfast and make sandwiches for lunchbags, and then prepare a delicious meal each evening which always included dessert. Several even jokingly complained that they came back from a mission trip and had actually "gained" weight!!

All in all, it was a wonderful week and we came back knowing each other better, old(er) and young alike. What a blessing it was to get to know the young people in our church a little better and realize our future is in good, hard working hands. We go on mission trips to bless others, but we come back having received far more than we gave. Somehow, I think God knew this all along.
